Your Durham Catholic PIC (DCPIC) has been in existence since 1998, which was then known as the Regional Council. It should be noted that this partnership between school and home was established before it was recently mandated by the government in 2011. This clearly demonstrates the respect for parents' voice and input at our school board. We look forward to working together with our schools and our parishes as we strengthen and promote our enduring gift of Catholic education.

Every parent has a valuable voice. As Pope Francis recently addressed in his Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium, "if we are to share our lives with others and generously give of ourselves, we also have to realize that every person is worthy of our giving."
