September Report

- Orientation and Mass Commissioning
 - a) Plans are underway to host this annual event with school council chairs and principals

- Subcommittees

- Elections

 - b) Advertisements for the 7 vacancies are being posted this week. They will be shared with principals for school websites and distribution. They will be put on both websites, the board and the DCPIC. As well, on parish bulletins.
- OAPCE (Ontario Association of Parents in Catholic Education)
 - a) OAPCE is celebrating their 75th Anniversary this year!
 - b) The OAPCE conference will take place on May 23-24. It will be in Mississauga.
 - c) DCPIC needs to plan ahead for attendance, and how much of budget to commit to this conference for parents and committee members.

- PRO Grant 2013-2014
